“Duck Pond Park Official Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony”

West Windsor---Mayor Shing-Fu Hsueh presided over the official ribbon-cutting ceremony at the Duck Pond Park in West Windsor Township on Wednesday, October 5, 2016. Duck Pond Park consists of approximately 60 acres of nature preserve and 60 acres of active recreation.

The recreational area includes (3) illuminated soccer fields, (1) beach volleyball court, (2) basketball courts, (2) tennis courts and a walking trail. The pond which is named after the stream it borders, Duck Pond Run, will in the near future be available for fishing adding another element of enjoyment for our residents and visitors alike. Restroom facilities, a picnic pavilion and playground will be a future addition to the Duck Pond Park.

Mayor Hsueh stated, “I want to thank Mercer County for its generous Mercer at Play Grant. Duck Pond Park has become a second “community” park providing a recreational opportunity for this area of our township. I would also like to thank the West Windsor-Plainsboro Soccer Association for facilitating the creation of top-notch fields for youth sports, the Board of Recreation Commissioners for their invaluable advice and service to the township, and the West Windsor Department of Public Works for their assistance in maintaining our Park System.”
