Definition: Sexting is the slang term for the use of a cell phone or other similar electronic device to distribute pictures or video of sexually explicit images. It can also refer to text messages of a sexually-charged nature.







- Sexting (a portmanteau of sex and texting) is the act of sending sexually explicit messages or photos electronically, primarily between cell phones.
- the act of text messaging someone in the hopes of having a sexual encounter with them later; initially casual, transitioning into highly suggestive and even sexually explicit



















- •While it may be shocking, the practice of "sexting" sending nude pictures via text message is not unusual, especially for high schoolers around the country.
- •In October a Texas eighth-grader spent the night in a juvenile detention center after his football coach found a nude picture on his cell phone that a fellow student sent him.
- •Roughly 20 percent of teens admit to participating in "sexting," according to a <u>nationwide survey (pdf)</u> by the National Campaign to Support Teen and Unplanned Pregnancy.

- •The image was blurred and the voice distorted, but the words spoken by a young Ohio woman are haunting. She had sent nude pictures of herself to a boyfriend. When they broke up, he sent them to other high school girls. The girls were harassing her, calling her a slut and a whore. She was miserable and depressed, afraid even to go to school.
- •And now Jesse Logan was going on a Cincinnati television station to tell her story. Her purpose was simple: "I just want to make sure no one else will have to go through this again."




Posting private identity information online puts teens at risk of unwanted invitations for sex.

False. Contrary to media hype, the typical online child predator does not carefully piece together identity information to locate and abduct unwilling teens. More typically, teens who go off with adult predators go willingly after a period of online romantic and sexual talk. It's the *combination* of talking sexually to a stranger and providing private identity information that is risky.

True. If you post sexually provocative photos of yourself online, you are probably going to get more contacts from strangers. And some of those contacts may be aggressive and scary. Some will be from adults and some will be from other teens.







Sending sexy photos of yourself or other teens over the Internet may result in these photos being passed around the Internet.

True. Strangers who ask for sexual photos of teens may end up passing them along on the Internet, in violation of child pornography laws. These laws say that the possession, distribution, or production of sexual images of minors is a crime. There has been at least one case in which a boyfriend and girlfriend who e-mailed intimate photos of themselves back and forth were arrested for child pornography.









Your Online Audiences

Deciding how to present yourself online is a bit more complicated. For one thing, you cannot always know who your audience is.

Social networking sites may feel as private as hanging out with your friends. In reality, they are vast public spaces where privacy settings may or may not provide the kind of privacy you expected. Do you know that...

• The content you post on profiles and blogs sticks around the Internet forever—even after you decide to take it down.

- The information, photos, and videos you post about yourself can be found easily by searching, sometimes even if you thought you marked them private.
- The content you create—photos, drawings, videos, writing—can be copied by anyone and used for any purpose without your permission.
- Even if you use privacy controls offered by social networking sites, there are always invisible audiences, that is, audiences you didn't intend to see your stuff. Sometimes you might not care, but other times you might.





Who Else Controls Your Image?

It's not enough to think about how *you* present yourself. Your friends on social networks, video and photo sharing sites, and blogs may also share information about you. Check around. Are your friends posting photos of you and tagging them so that everyone knows what you are doing? Do your friends leave posts on your profile that reveal more about you than you want

others to know?







Be Cyber Smart **

- Explore the privacy tools on the sites you use and decide how public or private your stuff should be.
- Consider your "invisible" audience when you post online. And remember that there is no guarantee of privacy online.
- Monitor what others are posting about you in comments, photos, videos, and blogs.
- Read the Privacy Policy or Terms of Service of any network you join. Understand what information about you is collected and how it is sold to and used by others.

Cell Phone Safety





Nearly half (47%) of US teens say their social life would end or be worsened without their cell phone, and nearly six in 10 (57%) credit their mobile device with improving their life, according to a national survey from CTIA and Harris Interactive.



Four out of five teens (17 million) carry a wireless device (a 40% increase since 2004)

Impact on Teen Life

- A majority (57%) of teens view their cell phone as the key to their social life.
- Second only to clothing, teens say, a person's cell phone tells the most about their social status or popularity, outranking jewelry, watches and shoes.



Providing Entertainment and Security

- More than half of the respondents (52%)
 agree that the cell phone has become a new
 form of entertainment.
- One-third of teens play games on their phone.
- 80% say their cell phone provides a sense of security while on the go, confirming that the cell phone has become their mobile safety net when needing a ride (79%), getting important information (51%), or just helping out someone in trouble (35%).



- Providing Entertainment and Security
 - Teens carry cell phones to have access to friends, family and current events.
 - Though only one in five (18%) teens care to pinpoint the location of their family and friends via their cell phone, 36% hate the idea of a cell phone feature that allows others to know their exact location.



- Texting Replacing Talking
- The study also confirmed that texting is replacing talking among teens. Teens admitted spending nearly an **equal amount of time** talking as they do texting each month. The feature is so important to them that if texting were no longer an option 47% of teens say their social life would end or be worsened that's especially so among females (54% vs. 40%).



- Texting Replacing Talking
- With more than 1 billion text messages sent each day, it is no surprise that 42% of teens say they can text blindfolded, the study found.







- Cell phone usage by 10 to 17 year olds can be as high as 3 to 4 hours a day
- 44% of teens said they use text messages
 as their primary source of communications
- With text messages being sent from the movies and the dinner table
- 26% said it's the first thing they do in the morning



- What is the problem?
- Cell phones are used to
 - Transmit inappropriate pictures of friends
 - Harass others with hate messages
 - Use text messages to send answers during tests
 - Take pictures of exams and send them to friends





- They are also used to
 - Make drug transactions
 - Make contact with child predators masking themselves as other teens
 - Countless other crimes
 - Distract teen drivers and cause countless motor vehicle accidents



- Set appropriate ground rules for use of wireless devices. (Contract)
- Decide who they may communicate with and how they may use these devices.







- Monitor your wireless bill to keep track of the amount of time your children spend talking and sending messages and with whom.
- Pay special attention to numbers or messages from people you do not recognize or have not approved.



- Teach your students to tell you if anyone sends them a threatening or frightening message.
- If your students are being stalked, harassed, or threatened in any way, report the incident to the Police





- Consider creating settings to control or prohibit access to the Internet, e-mail, and text messaging through your children's wireless device.
- Remember a global-positioning system (GPS) option, if offered by your service provider, could be used to help locate your children if lost.







More students disciplined following girl's suicide

More students have been removed from a Massachusetts school in the investigation of the alleged bullying campaign against a 15-year-old girl who committed suicide, a school official said Tuesday.

Nine students at the school have been charged in what a prosecutor described Monday as a months-long campaign of bullying that led to the suicide in January of Phoebe Prince.

"We have taken disciplinary action with an additional small group of students and they have been removed from the high school," Christine Sweklo,



- •The best way to counter this problem is by teaching our children (and ourselves) to Take 5! put down the mouse and step away from the computer.
- •By not reacting and taking the time to calm down, we can avoid becoming a cyberbullying ourselves.
- •What can we do for 5 minutes to help us calm down? Kids have suggested: throwing a baseball or shooting hoops, baking cookies, reading, napping, taking a walk or a run, watching TV, talking to a friend and hugging a stuffed animal.



- •Before sending that e-mail or posting on that Web site or bulletin board, think before you click "send." Re-read what you were going to send. If it meets any of these factors, don't send it until you fix them. And if you can't fix them, maybe you shouldn't send it at all.
- •It's so easy for anyone to misunderstand e-mails and cybercommunications. We have to be very very careful to make them clear and help others to understand what we really mean. We also need to be careful not to hurt others and be good netizens.



- •Start by making sure you are sending things to the right place, that it arrives and that the right person gets it.
- •Is it worth sending? Don't waste peoples' time or bandwidth with junk, chain e-mails and false rumors
- •Proofread and spell-check your e-mails and make sure they know who you are
- •Don't attack others online, say anything that could be considered insulting or that is controversial
- •Don't forward other people's e-mails without their permission or share their personal information (BCC)
- •Are you angry when you are writing this message?
- •Don't reply to spam, even to ask to be removed from their mailing list
- •How private is the message you are sending? Are you willing to have others read this message or forward it to others without your permission?





•Our kids need to know that the online services and ISPs will provide their identity pursuant to legal process. And they can be found and held responsible for what they say and do online. It's very important that we teach our children to understand accountability, online and offline. Schools can be very helpful here. Unfortunately, sometimes when cyberbullying occurs the schools get involved in trying to discipline the students for offhours and off-premises activities, often to their detriment.


