

Take Action to Poison Proof Your Home While Spring Cleaning

National Poison Prevention Week, March 15-21, 2015, has been nationally recognized for more than 50 years by poison centers across the country as well as US Presidents. Use this time to inspect your entire home for any medicines or household products, such as detergents, cleaning products, pesticides and fertilizers, car maintenance products, and snow melting products, that may not be stored properly and correct the situation immediately to prevent a mishap. These as well as others should be locked up out of sight and reach of children and pets.



Project Medicine Drop was developed to halt the abuse and diversion of prescription drugs. It allows residents to dispose of unused and expired medications anonymously 24 hours a day, 365 days a year at “prescription drug drop boxes” located within the headquarters of participating police departments.

Prescription drug drop off box is available to residents at West Windsor Police Department located at **20 Municipal Drive, West Windsor Township, NJ 08550**. The drop boxes accept solid pharmaceuticals such as pills, capsules, patches, inhalers, and pet medications.

Products containing mercury such as old thermometers should be kept out of the trash. Mercer County accepts old mercury thermometers, and West Windsor residents are encouraged to drop off mercury thermometers during Mercer County’s Household Hazardous Waste/Electronic Recycling Drop OFF dates:
