This month's opera appreciation class will feature a bit of compare and contrast. We've supplied attendees with a libretto for Georges Bizet's 1875 opera CARMEN which scandalized audiences when it premiered. In 1943, Oscar Hammerstein II fulfilled a long-time dream by adapting the music of Bizet to a new story and a libretto of his own creation, CARMEN JONES, resetting the action from Seville in Spain to the American South. It was extremely popular, running for 503 performances. After reading the libretto and seeing the 1954 film version, we'll discuss how the changes added to or detracted from the original.
